A Celebration of Belonging and Community

The parade begins at Hough Elementary School. Participants will head north on Daniels Street to 24th Street, then proceed east to Main Street, followed by a southward march along Main to McLoughlin, returning to Hough Elementary. The best viewing spots are along Main Street between 24th Street and McLoughlin. Please note there may be road closures along the parade route.

Each year, the Hough Foundation sponsors and organizes the Paddy Hough Parade, an event that allows the students of Hough Elementary to celebrate the legacy of their school's namesake, Patrick Hough. This joyful celebration is also shared with community members, elected officials, educational groups, and municipal organizations.

Born on March 17, 1846, in Tipperary, Ireland, Patrick "Paddy" Hough led an adventurous life. In 1870, he volunteered as a medic in the Franco-Prussian War, where he tragically lost his left arm. Later, after emigrating from Ireland due to the hardships of the Irish Potato Famine, he found work as a teacher. He eventually settled in Vancouver, Washington, where he made a profound impact on the education system and his community.

Throughout his career, Hough became known not only for his deep commitment to education but also for his advocacy of equality. He integrated his classrooms and championed acceptance.. His leadership and belief in the power of education left an enduring legacy, both in the classroom and beyond.

In 1908, Hough retired, but after World War I, he returned to the classroom as deputy superintendent for Clark County Schools. When he passed away in 1925, his generosity surprised many, as he had quietly accumulated wealth. Hough bequeathed a significant portion of his fortune to establish an agricultural school, which now exists as the Center for Agriculture, Science, and Environmental Education in Brush Prairie.

In 1941, Hough Elementary was named in his honor, located in the historic Hough Neighborhood. Fifty years later, in 1991, Mina Milligan, a beloved fifth-grade teacher at Hough Elementary, envisioned a parade to honor Hough's legacy. She believed this would foster a deep sense of community pride. After entrusting the organization to the Hough Foundation, the parade grew into the beloved event it is today. Mina passed away in 2023, but her vision lives on in the students and community.

At Hough Elementary, there's a saying: "The sun always shines on the Paddy Hough Parade, no matter what the weather!" We look forward to another wonderful celebration that honors the spirit of community, education, and the students of Hough Elementary.

I am Ms. Green Bags

Hi Neighbors! I am also known as your Neighborhood Coordinator for the Clark Neighbors Food Project. Every two months, I collect non-perishable food and toiletries from 28 Arnada neighbors and donate to FISH of Vancouver Westside Food Pantry.

I would like to expand to also donate to the Family and Community Resource Center (FCRC) at Hough Elementary School. Hough is the neighborhood elementary school for Arnada. Hough currently has 257 students enrolled. 47 of those students are considered homeless and 56% of students live in homes with income below the federal poverty line. The role of the FCRC is to connect families in need with community resources, but they always have emergency basics on hand to help with household supplies or food when needed. Toiletries are always welcome because families cannot buy these with food stamps. Soap, laundry soap, toilet paper, diapers, body wash, dish soap, feminine hygiene products, cleaning spray, etc are all welcome and needed donations. Other items they can use are new socks and underwear, children's sweatpants and leggings. Gas cards are also welcome. The FCRC is unable to use hotel-sized toiletries, open toiletries, or used socks or underwear.

To keep things manageable, I will continue food deliveries to FISH and toiletries to Hough. If Hough has specific food needs, I will send that info to donors ahead of time.

Our next Green Bag pickup day is Saturday, April 12.
