December Meeting is the Holiday Party!

Just When You Thought Elections Were Over.....

We are going to have a small and very local one. You know the old adage “All politics are local?” This one is NOT political it's all about a little service and a lot of local community. Our Association Chairperson, Ken Visser, is stepping down in January after fulfilling the role for more years than we will ever ask anyone to do. Fortunately he's willing to remain on the Board so that will leave his successor with continuity and an invaluable mentorship and advice. Contact any Board member to discuss your interest in this.

And that's not our only need to keep this organization on track. The Vice-Chair position has been vacant. Our current Secretary Brenda will be moving from the neighborhood soon and must resign. We also need board members who are not one of the officers but are voting members of the Board and take on projects and events. You may be nominated by another, or you may nominate yourself.

The ANA board collectively acts as a liaison to the City of Vancouver. As needed, they organize neighborhood comments on City, State or Federal proposals that affect the neighborhood. They organize and direct activities such as park cleanups, history walks, the street mural painting, Christmas party, park concerts, and neighborhood clean-ups. They may participate in wider city-oriented groups such as the Vancouver Neighborhood Alliance or functions organized by the Uptown or Downtown Business Associations.

The ANA Bylaws sketch out the duties of the officers as follows:

The officers manage the meetings, planning sessions and activities of the neighborhood association.

Chairperson acts as the primary executive officer and presides over deliberations and activities of the neighborhood association. serves as the official spokesperson for the association.

Vice-Chair assists the Chairperson in all of the duties and performs the functions of the Chairperson in his/her absence.

Secretary acts in conjunction with the officers, keeps the minutes of all of the association's public and executive meetings and also serves as spokesperson for the association when appointed to do so.

The Bylaws also provide that:

- All Officers must continuously reside within the boundaries of Arnada Neighborhood.
- All Officers are expected to attend scheduled Board Meetings and General Meetings

We plan to hold ANA officer elections at our February 2026 neighborhood association meeting. We need candidates for the ballot as soon as possible so that we can publish it in the newsletter prior to voting. Please consider stepping up to serve, guide and represent your neighborhood. Treasurer Report We have \$350 in uncashed checks because the neighborhood clean-up gave it all to us to give to the other neighborhoods. We have \$900 more than we had in January.

City News Lee Gelsinger:

Asked to look into the trash on E and Fourth Plain. Asked code people and lots of complications involved with that situation. Drove by today and the home owner is deceased. Will work with codes to get the trash services back up. It's mandatory. The removal of trash from the sidewalk is easy, but they will have trash service going forward. The address is confusing because it's split down the middle from the north and south. The house is owned by the bank.

Statistics updates: District 1 makes me proud. Crime reduced in the last year by 61%. Most neighborhoods it's in the teens. More crimes have been reported citywide. Only 128 crimes in the last year which is not that much. Top 5 are destruction of property, shoplifting, an assault and a burglary-non-residential.

Samantha Smith - Clark County Museum:

It's been in the Carnegie building since 1964. Prior to that the building was the first Vancouver library. We believe every story matters. Care for over 100,000 items in our collection. We are a 501-3c non-profit. There are only 4 paid employees with 30 volunteers. We are looking for new people to volunteer all the time. We have helped save various historical buildings including the Slocum House. They also help with interpretative services. At the museum we have three exhibits, with a new exhibit on Fort Vancouver opening up December 13th. They have a research library with maps that we can use with our neighborhood membership. You don't need to make a reservation to do that with the membership. WSU Vancouver houses the digital collection. There are member only events monthly. They will be closed the last two weeks of December and all of January for the new visitor area. They will re-open in February

Hop on the Bike Bus!

Hello members!

The Hough PTSA is partnering with Local Links and Cycle Vancouver with the support of the Vancouver School District, the City of Vancouver SafeRoute's program, and Bike Clark County to bring a Bike Bus to Hough Elementary!

What is a Bike Bus?

A bike bus is a group of trained adults and parents who ride along a set route on specific mornings and "pick up" youth to ride, walk, or scoot to school—much like a school bus.

Bike Buses promote youth being fun, safe, social, and healthy. Bicycling and walking to school has also been shown to increase academic performance versus being driven.

Step 1: Who's interested?

We are in the initial stages of establishing a "bus route" and need to know who is interested before we can finalize the route.

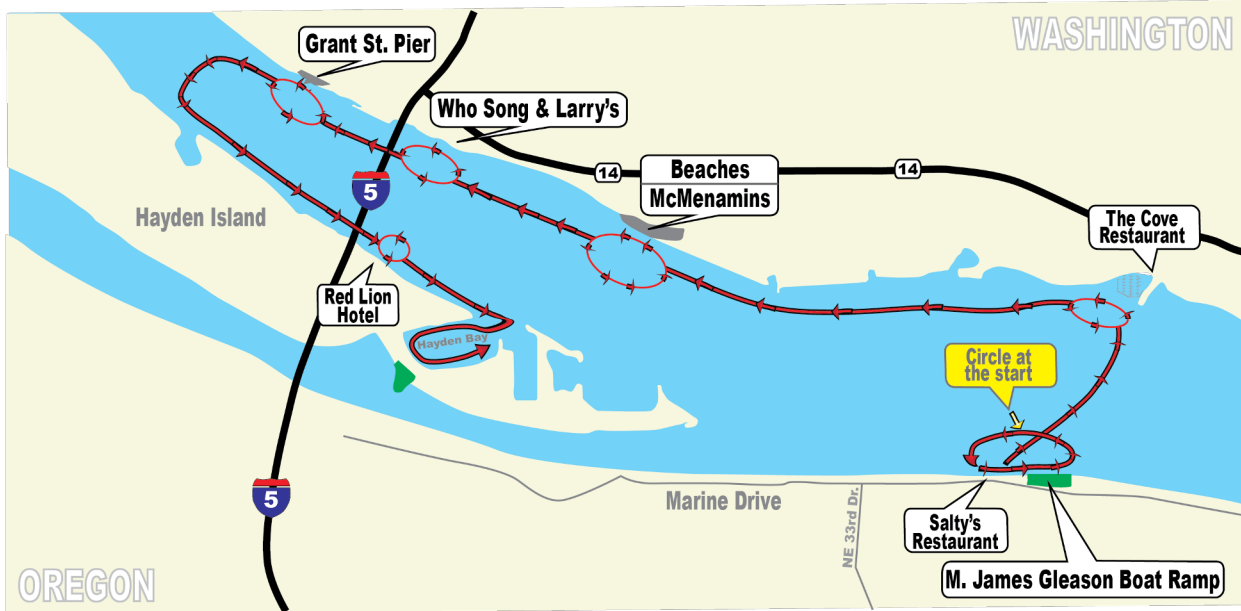
Christmas Ships at the Waterfront
